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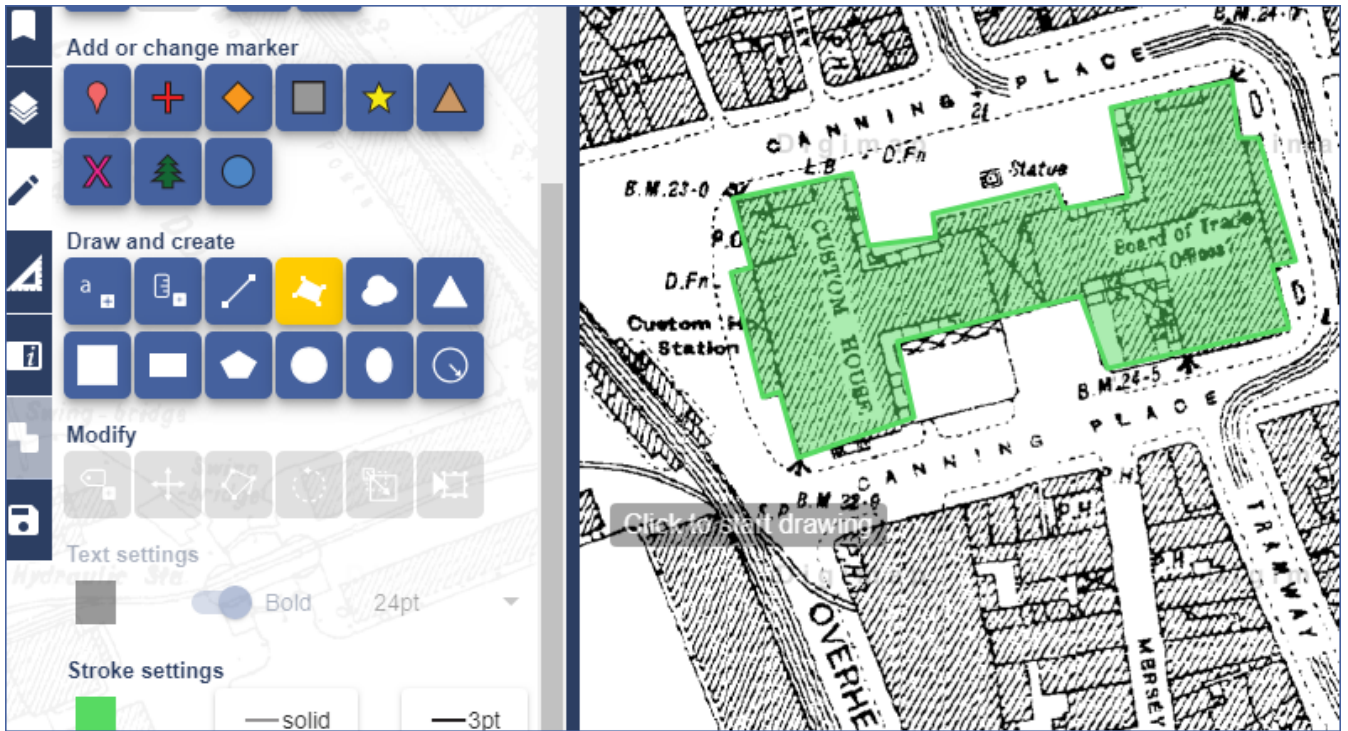
1. View and compare historic maps:

1. Open Historic Roam.
2. Search for Albert Dock. Select Albert Dock (Liverpool) from the results.
3. Select 1920s from the timeline.
4. Zoom in on the Custom House (to the east of Albert Dock – see image above). Remember
5. Select 2up from the top toolbar.
6. Select 1950s from your second timeline.
7. Select 2up again to return to the 1920s map.

2. Add a drawing and save your map:

1. Open the Drawing tools.
2. Select Shape, then Polygon.
3. Add a polygon over Custom House (1920s map) – see image on page 2.
4. Click Save > My Map, naming it Custom House.
5. Select Contemporary on the timeline, to see what's on the site now.
