Your tasks:

1. Go to a location of interest – we've chosen Telford.
2. Select the Crop Map 2018 Basemap.
3. Now select 2up view.
4. Select a different basemap on the right hand side, e.g. Dudley Stamp 1930s Basemap.
5. Change the opacity of the Dudley Stamp map to full opacity – drag the slider bar all the way to the right.
6. Select the Get Feature information tool from the top toolbar.
7. Select any points of interest on the map and an information box will pop up. NOTE: this is not possible with the Dudley Stamp map.

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
