

1. Import a file of map data:

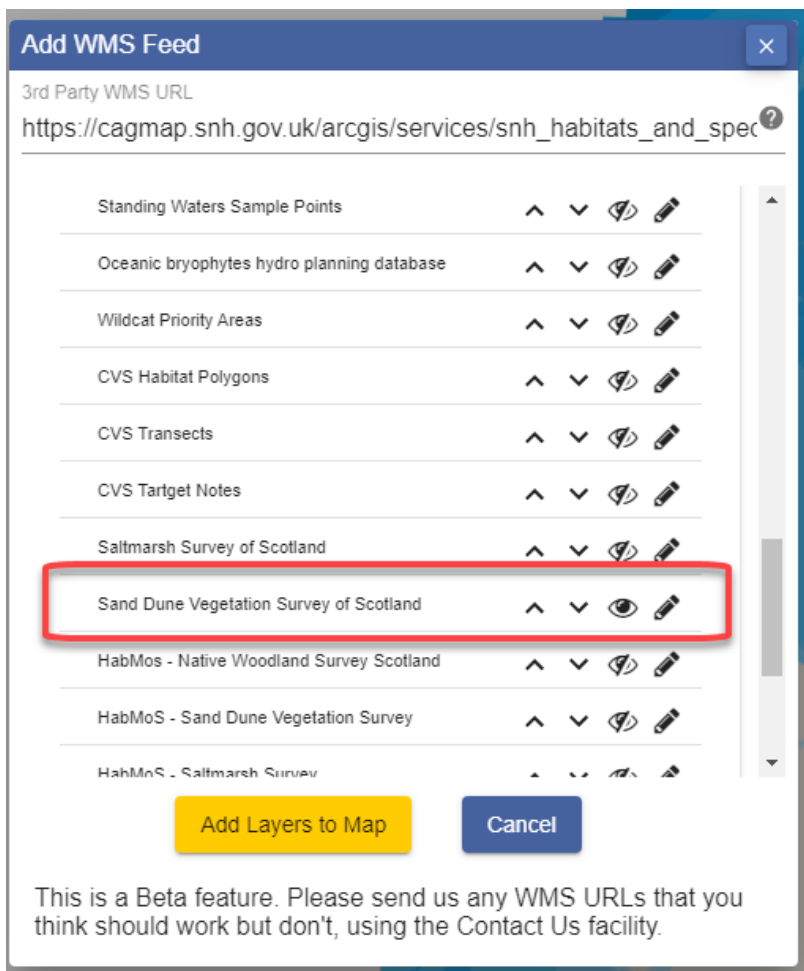
1. In Marine Roam, open Drawing Tools > Import.
2. Select Choose File.
3. Select the file [MPA_SCOTLAND_ESRI.zip](#).*
4. Select Import.
5. You should see a notification that your import was successful.
6. Your map should resemble the map image above.

- * The file is of Nature Conservation Marine Protected Areas, as designated under the Marine and Coastal Access Act 2009 and the Marine (Scotland) Act 2010. For more information, [see the Scottish Natural Heritage data site](#).

2. Add and view a Web Map Service:

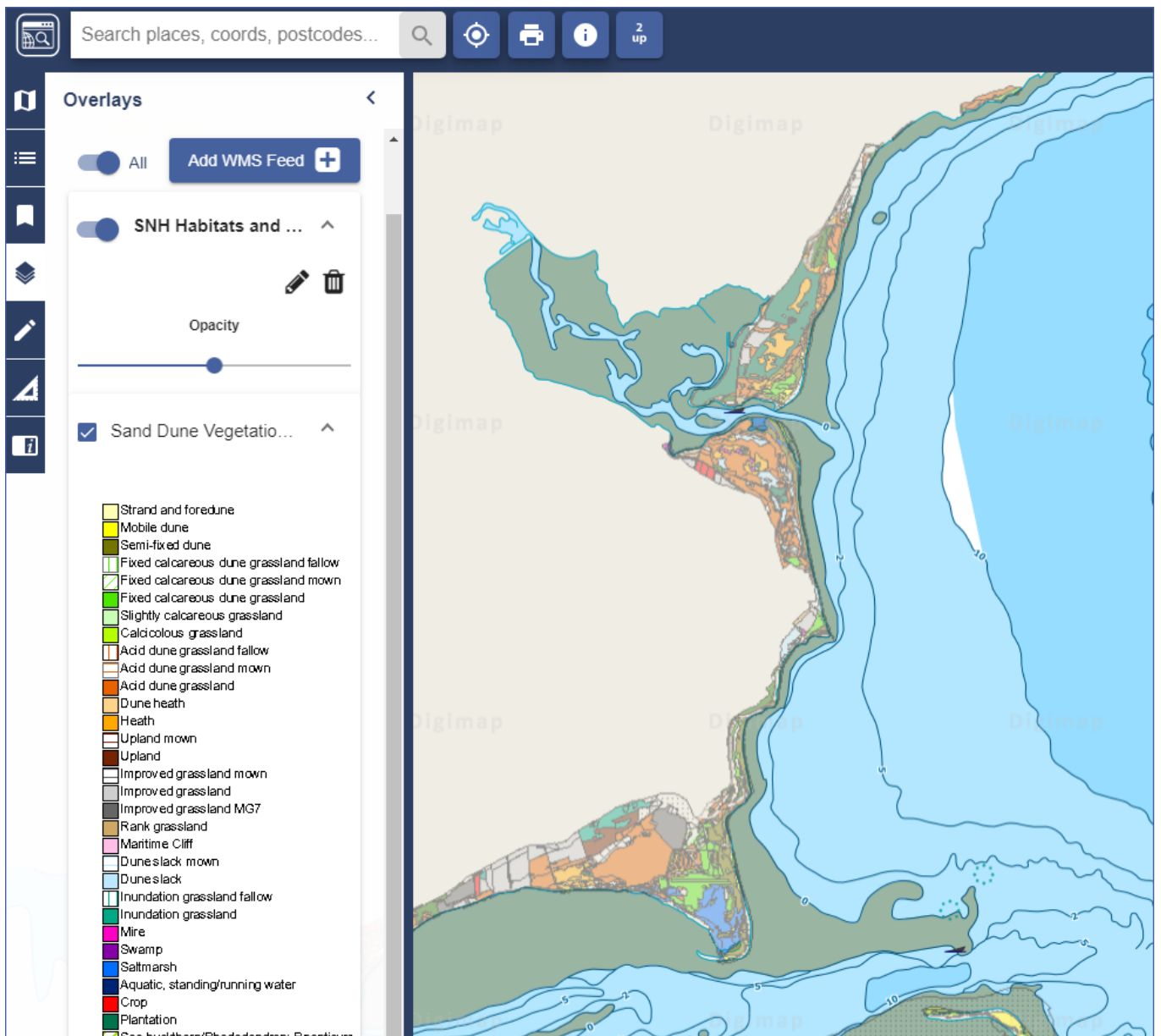
You can also add geographic data in the Overlays menu.

1. In Marine Roam, open Overlays.
2. Select Add WMS Feed.
3. We have identified a web map service from Scottish Natural Heritage, which can display habitats and species.*
4. Copy and paste the following URL into the field **3rd Party WMS URL:**
https://cagmap.snh.gov.uk/arcgis/services/snh_habitats_and_species/MapServer/WMServer
5. Select **Get Layers**.
6. Then select a layer to add to your map, e.g. Sand Dune Vegetation Survey.
7. By default, all layers are on. To hide the other layers, select the eye icons – see image below. We would not recommend adding lots of layers to the map – this would take a long time to load.
8. Select **Add Layers to map**.
9. You should now be able to see your layer in the Overlays tool and on your map. See the image on the next page.
